Gate 2

Further progress has been made on improving the Gate 2 entrance/exit. Thank you to the parents/caregivers that have shown patience whilst changes have been made and to those that assist the staff to make the pickup process flow in the afternoons. There are still some concerns regarding parent/caregiver driving behaviour which we would appreciate being addressed –

- U-turns in the driveway should not be happening
- Parking on the roadside should not be happening there have been complaints from the Council and other drivers due to this behaviour. If you are parking on the roadside you are obstructing the visibility of drivers exiting the gateway and are endangering other road users. We do not allow students to climb the boundary fence or exit by foot through the gateway.
