Room 8 were super creative, critical and innovative with their thinking. A lot of valuable learning took place. Maybe we will see some future astronauts and astrophysicists come from our class.





Facts about the tiny planet Pluto has 3 moons each named, Hydra, Charon and lastly a kerberos 200 million Pluto's could fit in the Sun if it was hollow. Only 170 Plutos could fit in our Earth. Pluto is able to fit 20 Pluto's stacked side by side in neptune.

Scarlett's Facts about Pluto





Makemake is in the kuiper belt and is beyond the orbit of neptune. It is slightly smaller than pluto and is the second brightest object in the kuiper belt as seen from earth Puto is the brightest.

Makemake colour is a reddish brown hue, though it's hard to tell. This dwarf planet was discovered on the 31st of march 2005.

Makemake is made out of frozen methane and nitrogen gases.

It takes about 16 years to get to Makemake.
