#### PRINCIPAL'S PIECE

Kia ora e te whānau.

It is hard to believe that we are at the end of our third term at school this year. We have enjoyed many fun and learning experiences, culminating in our Wearable Arts showcase this week.

Congratulations to the Kapa Haka group that represented Rotokauri School at the Kapa Haka festival in Raglan. Once again, you have done yourselves proud and we enjoyed watching your performance live streamed.

It is always disappointing to have to remind our parents/families about appropriate behaviour by them whilst on the school grounds. However, we are still experiencing problems in the bus bay and carpark. Adults are not role modelling the correct safety that we expect from them and students are witnessing these behaviours and the attitudes of adults when spoken to about their actions. Once again, please do not cross the carparks unless you are using the appropriate pedestrian crossings or crossings with our student volunteers. Please do not drive around one of the signs when they are out as this endangers our students. Lastly, a reminder that the bus bay is not a meeting point for parents to lean into vehicles to have discussions, as it is a 'drive through' system – drivers are to remain in their vehicles whilst in the bus bay. Parents/family members should pick up students from safe places within the school and they should be actively supervising these students. Students should not be walking around cars or within the carpark unsupervised. We would appreciate an improvement in adult behaviour as student safety is paramount to staff.

It is also sad to have to share the following statement from our librarian Sarah Dyer in regards to the treatment of our valuable library assets.

Our library is a treasure trove of learning and imagination, however this year has been the worst for library books being damaged beyond repair. Ten books so far this year have been written off due to being irreparably marked with drawings and scribbles, and countless others have been returned with ripped pages, or soggy and mouldy pages. Rotokauri School is incredibly lucky to still have a school library and we need everyone's help to keep it in great shape. We would rather spend the small library budget we have on purchasing new books rather than replacing existing books. Please remind your child to handle books gently and to respect them as valuable resources. This also means supervising preschoolers around Rotokauri School library books. With your support, we can ensure that our library remains a wonderful place for all to enjoy. Thank you for your cooperation.

On a more positive note, thank you for your ongoing support this term. We hope everyone has a relaxing holiday and we will start back at school on Monday 14 October. Have fun practising your Ag Day activities, ready for our annual competition in the first week back. Also, remember that we need to be wearing a Rotokauri School sunhat during Term 4, with no embellishments or writing on it and a functioning toggle.

#### **Crawshaw Enrolment Zone Consultation**

#### Consultation notice

The Ministry of Education has identified that Crawshaw School is at risk of becoming overcrowded and has given the school Board notice of this.

After consultation with the Board, we have developed a proposed enrolment scheme for Crawshaw School under section 72 of the Education and Training Act 2020.

As part of this process, we are consulting with the school's community and with people living in the area for which the school is a reasonably convenient school.

The enrolment scheme could affect which school a student will be entitled to enrol in, or school transport entitlements.

This is a practical activity where they will learn and practice how to respond when a person needs care in a cardiac arrest. This means they will learn how to give CPR to their teddy. Children will join a practical demonstration via a video which will require them to use a teddy, soft toy or cushion to practice on. Any soft toy or cushion, ideally something at least 20cm in length, would work perfectly. Children will need to bring their teddy, soft toy or cushion to school on this day. 

I am Carter, a spiky dragonfly with a stinger. I had to use a hot glue gun to put my insect together. It took two days. My legs are yellow and blue.








I am Karish-spiky-insect and I can climb up trees. I have hooks on my legs so I can climb up big trees.
