

BOT NEWS

Congratulations to Nick Hoebergen and Sarah-Lee Crellin for being co-opted onto the Board of Trustees. We hope you both enjoy your time with the committee and learning about governing a school.

Thank you to Brad Kells, Nathan Rogers and John Boswell for working during the school holidays to install a new concrete driveway down onto the bottom field. It looks amazing and is just in time for our annual car show and gala.

Our ballot for 2025 has now closed and names will be drawn next week. Thank you to the many people that put their child's name forward to enrol at Rotokauri School.

The new Kindo payment system is working well and we appreciate the families that have joined already.

The last day of term for this year is officially Monday 16th December – schools must be open for 384 half days in 2024.

Next year Rotokauri School will start on Monday 3rd February and finish on Monday 15th December 2025 (a total of 386 half days).

School donations – for the first time in many years the BOT have decided to increase the school donations for 2025. We still remain one of the cheapest in our cluster and really appreciate the contributions that we receive from families. School donations will be - \$120 per year per student, \$280 maximum per family (more than two students).

The BOT have decided to open the school swimming pool again over the summer season. Keys will be available from the school office at a cost of \$100, with a \$10 bond. If there is anybody that would be available to be on the swimming pool committee (subsidized key) please leave your name and phone number at the school office.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Medications

Please ensure that you come to the school office to fill out a medical form if your child requires medication during school hours. If your child needs to use an inhaler please ensure that they are brought to school, named and in a sealed plastic bag. No medications can be administered without written permission. Please do not bring 3 times a day antibiotics to be administered at school – this dosage is manageable at home. Only 4 times a day antibiotics will be given at school if needed.

If medication is held at school please take the time to check expiry dates and how much medication is available throughout the year, so that if needed the medication will work correctly when administered.

If your child has an allergy, is asthmatic or has other medical conditions that require a health plan please let the school office know so that these plans can be completed or updated (as per the Ministry of Health regulations).

Trophy Return

It is the time of year that we need to gather in all Rotokauri School cups and shields so they can be engraved. If you have any trophies at home i.e. speech, Agricultural Day and end of year awards from 2023 please return them to the school office a.s.a.p. Thank you to the students who have brought their trophies back already.


